Essential Skills:

- Reading – 5 times per week. This week I am sharing a short Tutorial/video from Ruth Miskin Read Write Inc which provides 10 things to think about when reading to your child at home. I hope you find it useful. Here is the link:

- Practise reading and spelling the new red words of the week (**Mr Mrs**), and previous words of the week I, the, my, me, put, of, she, he, to, go, no, you, said, be, are, all, was, some, come, for, like, people,
- Writing numbers 0-10. Some children might like to extend this to numbers 11-20.
- Continue to learn doubling facts for numbers 1-10. If your child knows these how about practising learning near doubles. E.g. If I know double 5 is 10. $5+4$ is easy because it is almost double 5. I just need to subtract 1 to know the answer is 10!

Practise reading and spelling the red words

I, the, my, me, put, of, she, he, to, go, no, you, said, be, are, all, was, some, come, for, like, people, Mr, Mrs.

Talk for Writing

This week we have been creating character profiles for the character 'the Princess' from our key text. We started by sharing and mind-mapping what we already knew about the Princess. We then thought of questions to ask the Princess to learn more. On Thursday the Princess visited the classroom and we interviewed her. The rest of Thursday and Friday were then used to write our character profiles. Great job Wren Class.

Maths:

This week in Maths we have been consolidating and practising our knowledge about doubling facts with numbers 1-10. We have been doing

this in a range of contexts using lots of different resources including Numicon, counting objects, dominoes, ladybird spots and ten frames. I have provided an optional Castle themed picture. Can you spot the different representations of number in the picture and then work out what double the amount would be? E.g. "I see 4 spots on the dragon, what is double 4?"

It would also be fantastic if the children could focus on writing numbers 0-10 correctly.

Next week

Monday 1st July – Wednesday 3rd July – Transition days to new classes.

Transition to new classes is happening across the whole school on these days. Miss Wratten (Starling Class Teacher) and Miss Bell (Jay Class Teacher) will be in school all week.

On Monday the classes will take turns to attend Woodland Wanderers as usual. This will be a lovely informal way to begin to build a relationship with their new teacher and spend time with their new class. On Tuesday and Wednesday the children will be based in their new classes with their new class teacher. They will also have time in provision including outside. They will be completing 'get to know me' activities alongside learning to make them more familiar with their new class and adults. We hope that this will reduce worries about starting in September.

The new reception children also join us on Friday 5th July in the morning. This will give our current children the opportunity to get to know their whole class. We are especially excited for this day and feel it will be a really positive end to our transition week at Wicklewood.
