Summer 2 Curriculum



Our English unit will focus on writing instructions for a reader based on a non-fiction model text called How to Catch a Dragon. By the end of the half-term, children will be able to write a set of instructions about how to catch a mythical creature of their choosing.

We will continue our science learning about living things and their habitats by exploring some specific habitats like the rainforest, the ocean and the Arctic. We will look at how plants and animals have adapted to live in different places before choosing a habitat and creating a diorama to represent it.

In our history lessons, we will answer the question "How did humans learn to fly?" We will learn about important figures in the history of flight such as the Wright Brothers, Amelia Earhart and Neil Armstrong.

In Art, we will continue working on our self-portrait proportions before using paint to mix our own unique skin tone, inspired by Angelica Dass and her Humanae project.
