We have been thinking about our ideal play areas for our school grounds and the children have drawn their own designs. The next stage is for them to design and build their ideas using junk modelling.

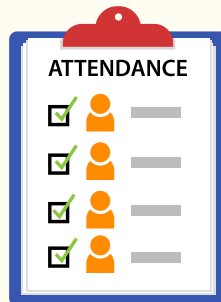
