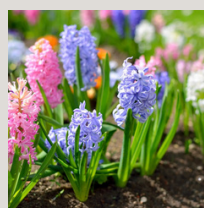
In Maths, we will be exploring Fractions, Adding and Subtracting 2-digit numbers and Money.
