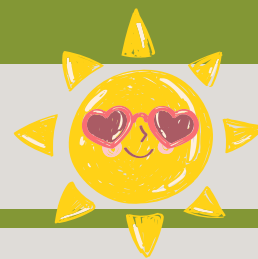




SWIFT CLASS SUMMER 1



Welcome to Summer 1 in Swift Class! In Science, we will be learning about 'Living things and their habitats - Habitats around the world', covering how environments are constantly changing, exploring the rainforest, describing ocean life and Arctic and Antarctic habitats.

In PSHE we will look at relationships in terms of family and friendships, thinking about trust and appreciation, resolving conflict and personal space.

We will continue to explore Programming in Computing, Athletics in PE and having a balanced diet in Food Tech.

On the first day back we will all be planting our very own tree at school which we have already been busy naming!
