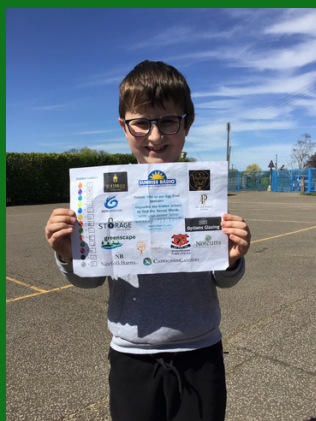

# Wicklewood Weekly

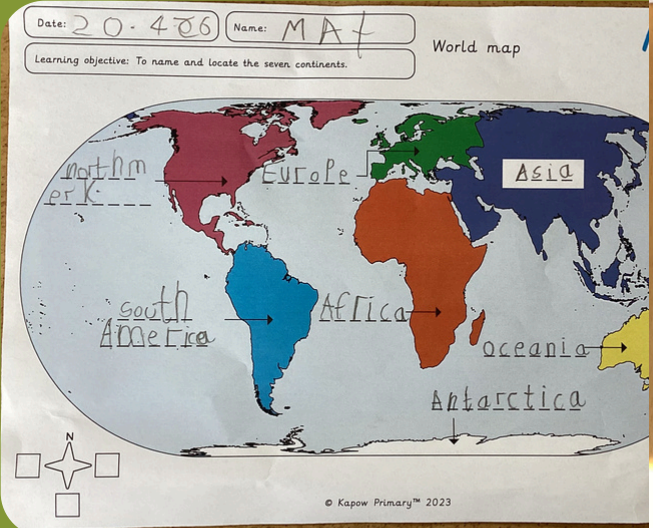

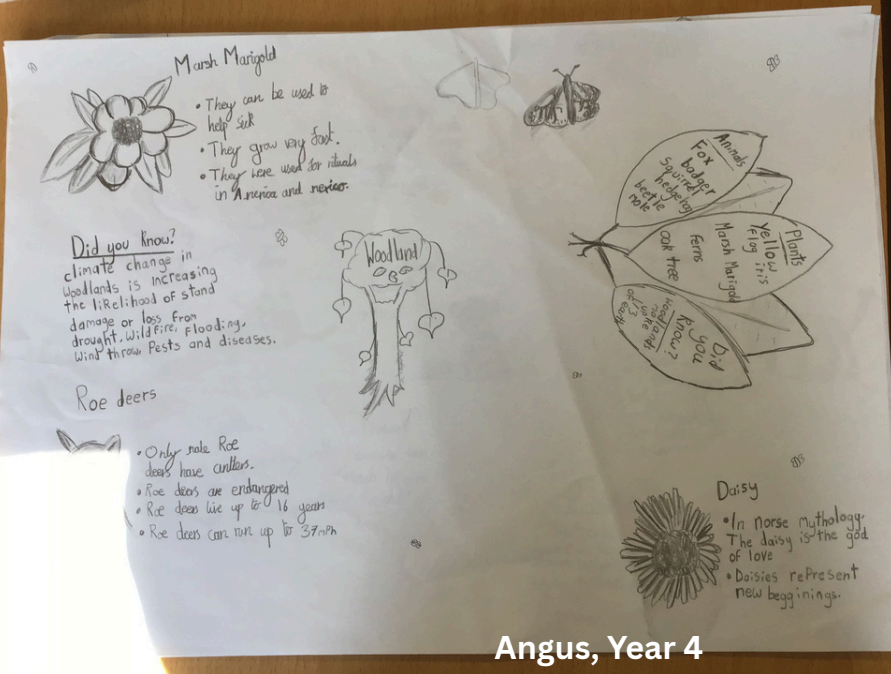


Pastoral

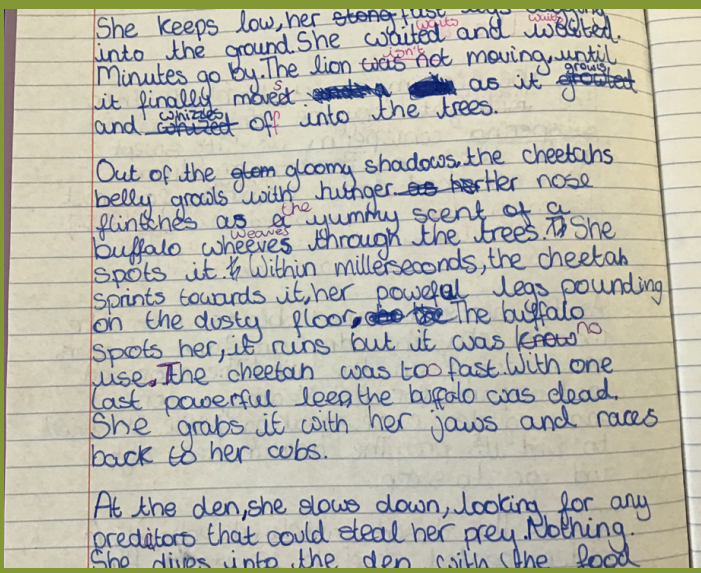

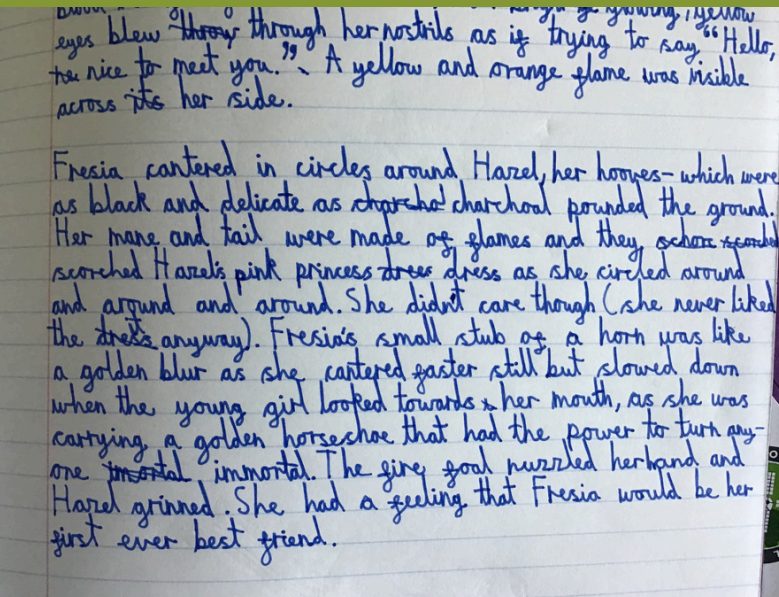

We thought it would be great to begin sharing some of the excellent work our pupils are doing in our newsletter. This week, there is some English, science and geography.

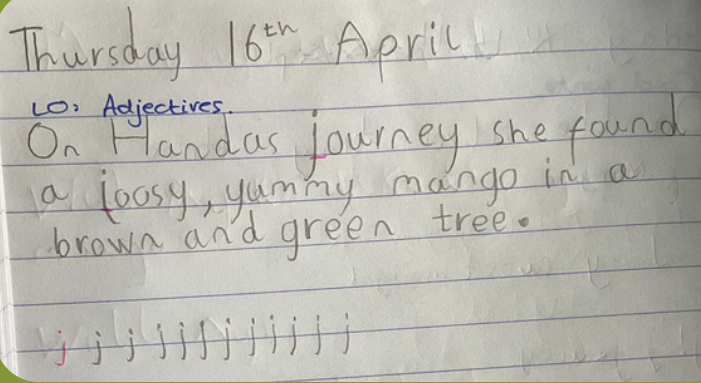
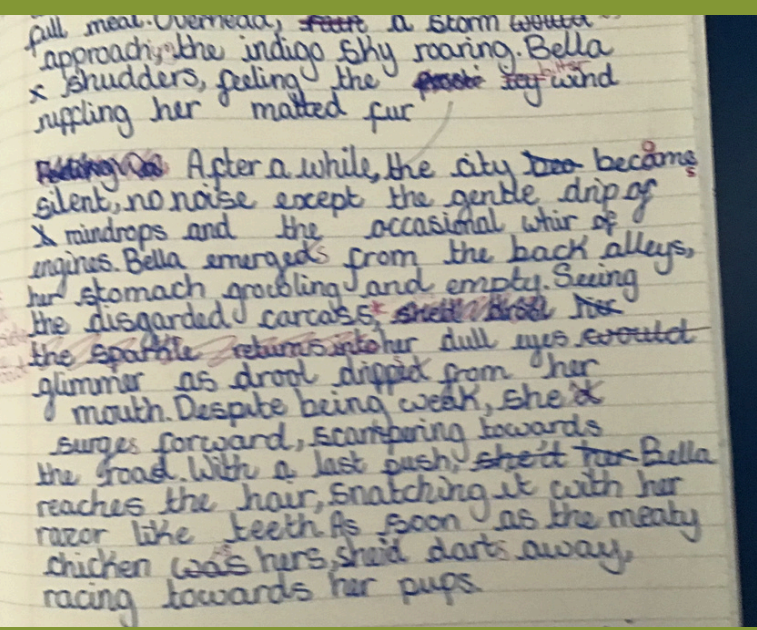

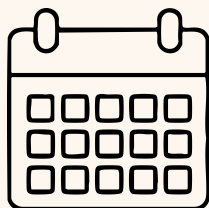

## Inquisitive

Wondering and questioning  
Exploring and investigating  
Challenging assumptions

I wonder why? Why didn't...? But what if...?  
I need to find out if... I want to know what...  
I can't decide unless I know if... I don't agree because...

I think I should look at this in a different way...  
I'd like to know even if...

This term's creative habit is 'Inquisitive'. We're asking our pupils to be more curious. As well as practising the habit of questioning, we're asking them to delve deeper, to find out more and to challenge what they're told to see if information is verifiable and can be found from a range of sources or places. This skill will be a particularly valuable one to take forward as online information and AI sources become more prevalent.

## SEND

April is Autism Acceptance Month. Recently, Mrs Grant held an assembly to talk about how some people see the world differently and how we can show up for people with Autism in our life.

Showing up can look like taking little steps to understand someone's experience of the world, allowing time for them to process, space for them to regulate or shifting our expectations and making it clear that it's okay.
