### Essential Skills:

- **Recognising Set 2 sounds** and continuing to revise Set 1.
- Practise reading and spelling the new red word of the week, and previous words of the week **was**, I, the, my, me, put, of, she, he, to, go, no, you, said, be, are, all
- Reading - **5 times per week.**
- Writing numbers 11-20 (the teen numbers) and knowing the value of tens and ones in that number.

## Maths:

This week in Maths we have been exploring 'first, then and now' maths stories as a method for deepening our understanding of addition.

For example, **First**, there were 5 children in the swimming pool. **Then** 3 more children got in. How many children are **now** in the pool?

Or, I **first** had 6 sweets from Dad. I **now** have 10 sweets. How many more sweets did Dad give you?

We have drawn pictures to represent our Maths 'First, then and now' stories in class.

See attached optional activity and see if your child can create a maths story of their own. In the activity a toy bus scenario is suggested for creating the story, but the context could easily be adapted to... number of fruits in the fruit bowl, people in the dolls house, teddies on the bed, or cars in the toy garage.
