Maths Home Learning

We have really only been testing this week but have had a single lesson which was focused around adding whole integers and decimal numbers. The children were all quite competent at knowing how to add using the standard column method but made several mistakes/misconceptions when adding decimals. It is important to remember the three-step golden rule below when adding decimal fractions:

- Write the numbers one on top of the other making sure to line the decimal points up with one another.

e.g. $\underline{12.47} + 6.249$

$$\begin{array}{r} 12.47 \\ + \underline{6.629} \\ \hline \end{array}$$

- Next fill any missing place value holders after the decimal point with a 0 if this helps to see the digits are lined up correctly.

e.g. $\begin{array}{r} 12.470 \\ + \underline{6.629} \\ \hline \end{array}$

- Finally, before adding the columns, make sure you have put the decimal point in the correct place first.

e.g. $\begin{array}{r} 12.470 \\ + \underline{6.629} \\ \hline \end{array}$

Have a go at the adding decimal fractions calculations below. I have also added a worded problem-solving activity to have a go at which will require you to use and apply your calculation skills.
