

# Rudolph's Relative Clauses



Relative clauses can be 'dropped in' to the middle of sentences after the noun it is giving extra information about. For example:

Amira wants a football for Christmas.

Amira, **who is very sporty**, wants a football for Christmas.

In the example above, the relative clause has been placed in the middle of the sentence after the noun 'Amira', which it gives more information about. Help Rudolph complete the sentences below by adding a relative clause to each one.
