Maths Home Learning

The focus this week has been percentages followed by ratio and relative sizes.

Remember ratio is part to part. Here is a model question to help you:

There are 48 carrots on an allotment patch. They are split equally into 8 rows. How many carrots are there in 5 rows?

1 row = 6 carrots	6
	12
	18
	24
5 rows = 30 carrots	30
	36
	42
8 rows = 48 carrots	48

8 rows = 48 carrots

1 row = 6 carrots ($48 \div 8 = 6$)

5 rows = **30 carrots** (5×6)
