Reading

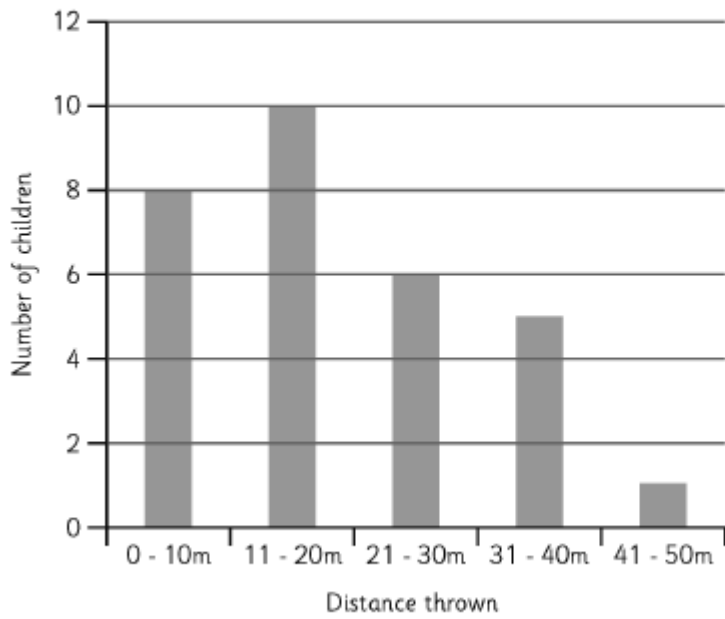

13. A class of children take part in a throwing a tennis ball competition. They record the results in the following bar chart.



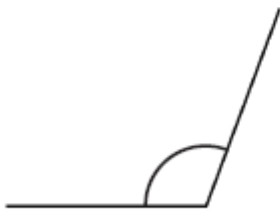
